

Deliberate Beauty


Keith Hallman of Paragon Landscaping and landscape architect Chuck Hess work together to deliberately create beauty in Bucks and Montgomery Counties

n Wyndmoor, Pennsylvania, a homeowner's property has become more like a park than a backyard. The eight-acre parcel of land with rolling, wooded topography has two converging streams bisecting the property. For Chuck Hess, Jr. and Keith Hallman, collaborating on landscape projects such as this one is a recipe for success. They are responsible for some of the most beautiful and innovative landscape projects in the Bucks and Montgomery Counties.

"This property is one that we're most proud of, as we have treated it more as a park than a heavily manicured estate," said Chuck, owner of Charles Hess Landscape Architects in Lansdale, PA., who has been in business since 1988. "I've been involved with this property since our company's inception, and while every step made during the design process has been deliberate, we have maintained a respect for the natural beauty already inherently found there."





Keith, who in 1997 founded Paragon Landscaping in Collegeville, Pennsylvania, has been working with Chuck for the past 15 years, and they have developed a close business relationship. Paragon Landscaping provides landscape installation, landscape maintenance, turf management and snow removal services. listens to their needs to determine if they need a landscape designer or a landscape architect. Once that determination is made, he refers clients to a landscape architect or he provides a landscape design to satisfy their landscaping needs.

"After the landscape design process is complete, we provide the client with the installation price. We then move on to perform the landscape installation in a neat, timely and professional manner, he said. "Finally,

after a project is completed, we continue to strengthen our relationships with our clients by maintaining the spaces we have installed and helping them with other projects they desire," said Keith.

Another one of Chuck and Keith's projects is very typical in scale and character to the jobs they work on together. The scope of this project in Gladwyne, PA, encompassed a pool, terraces, improving site circulation, and general garden design. However, unique to this project was the site's steep topography, which made these program elements challenging to integrate successfully. They incorporated an infinity pool with a 12 foot waterfall, an adjacent hanging garden and perimeter seating terraces, which all help mitigate the steep slope and simultaneously provide beautiful distant views for the client.

Both Keith and Chuck are proud of their memberships in organizations. Paragon Landscaping is a member of the Pennsylvania Landscape and Nursery Association (PLNA), the Professional Landscape Network (PLANET), and the Pennsylvania Turfgrass Council.
